Brown has been established and duly consummated in conformity to law, for the

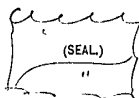
South half of South East quarter, and the South half of the South West quarter of Section twenty-six, in Township five North, of Range Seventeen West, in the District of Lands subject to sale at Grand Island, Nebraska, containing one hundred and sixty acres.

according to the Official Plat of the survey of the said land, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General:

Now Know Ye, That there is therefore granted by the United States unto the said John T. Brown the tract of land above described, to have and to hold the said tract of land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said John T. Brown and to his heirs and assigns forever.
