Whereas, There has been deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Lincoln, Nebraska, whereby it appears that, pursuant to the Act of Congress approved 20th May, 1862, "To Secure Homesteads to Actual Settlers on the Public Domain," and the acts supplemental thereto, the claim of Belvidere James Crockett, widow of Arthur J. Crockett, has been established and duly consummated, in conformity to law, for the North East Quarter of Section Two, Township Twelve North of Range Thirteen West of the Sixth Principal Meridian in Nebraska containing one hundred and fifty-five and fifty-one hundredths of an acre according to the Official Plat of the survey of the said Land, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General:

Now Know Ye, That there is, therefore, granted by the United States unto the said Belvidere James Crockett the tract of Land above described: TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract of Land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said Belvidere James Crockett and to her heirs and assigns forever.
