To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting:

Homestead Certificate No 7066

Application 11,750

Whereas there has been deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Grand Island Nebraska whereby it appears that pursuant to the Act of Congress approved 20th May 1862 "To secure Homesteads to actual Settlers on the Public Domain" and the acts supplemental thereto the claim of George Cadwalader has been established and duly consummated in conformity to law for the North West quarter of Section Six in Township Five North of Range Eighteen West of the Sixth Principal Meridian in Nebraska containing One Hundred and sixty six acres and forty one hundredths of an acre according to the Official Plat of the survey of the said land returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General. Now know ye that there is therefore granted by the United States unto the said George Cadwalader the tract of Land above described: To have and to hold the said tract of Land with the appurtenances thereof unto the said George Cadwalader and to his heirs and assigns forever.

In Testimony Whereof, I Benjamin Harrison, President of the United States of America have caused these letters to be made Patent and the seal of the General Land Office to hereunto affixed.

Given under my hand at the City of Washington the third day of November, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ninety one and of the Independence of the United States the one hundred and sixteenth.
