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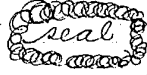

The United States of America, Be it all to whom these
 presents shall come, greeting:
 Certificate No. 1249. Whereas Alexander Calhoun
 of Buffalo County Nebraska has deposited in the
 General Land Office of the United States a certificate of
 the Register of the Land Office at Grand Island Nebras-
 ka whereby it appears that full payment has been
 made by the said Alexander Calhoun according the prov-
 isions of the act of Congress of the 24th of April 1820 entitled
 "an act making further provision for the sale of the
 Public Lands," and the acts supplemental thereto for
 the South West quarter of Section Threesix township
 eight, north of Range fifteen West of the Sixth Prin-
 cipal Meridian in Nebraska, containing one hundred
 and sixty acres according to the Official Plat of
 the Survey of the said lands, returned to the General
 Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said
 Tract has been purchased by the said Alexander
 Calhoun.

Now, know ye, That the United States of America
 in consideration of the premises, and in conformity
 with the several Acts of Congress in such case made
 and provided, have given and granted, and by these
 presents do give and grant unto the said Alexander
 Calhoun and to his heirs the said Tract above describ-
 ed: To have and to hold the same, together with all the
 rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances, of what-
 soever nature, thereunto belonging, unto the said Alex-
 ander Calhoun and to his heirs and assigns forever.

In testimony whereof, J. Chester A. Arthur, President
 of the United States of America, have caused these let-
 ters to be made patent and the seal of the General Land
 Office to be hereunto affixed.

Given under my hand at the City of Washington
 the twentieth day of January, in the year of our Lord
 one thousand eight hundred and eighty two, and of the
 Independence of the United States the one hundred and
 sixth.
