Whereas, There has been deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Lincoln, Nebraska, whereby it appears that, pursuant to the Act of Congress approved 20th May, 1862, "To Secure Homesteads to Actual Settlers on the Public Domain," and the acts supplemental thereto, the claim of Amosada J. O. Catterlin has been established and duly consummated, in conformity to law, for the Lot numbered Six of Section Twenty-second in Township Nine North of Range Thirteen West of the Sixth Principal Meridian in Nebraska, containing Twenty-four acres and forty hundredths of an acre according to the Official Plat of the survey of the said Land, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General:

Now Know Ye, That there is, therefore, granted by the United States unto the said Amosada J. O. Catterlin the tract of Land above described: TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract of Land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said Amosada J. O. Catterlin and to his heirs and assigns forever.

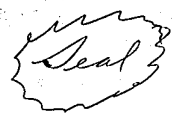

Judd has been established and duly consummated, in conformity to law, for the East half of the North West Quarter and the West half of the North East Quarter of Section Twenty-two in Township Ten North of Range Thirteen West, in the district of lands subject to sale at Grand Island, Nebraska; containing one hundred and thirty acres according to the Official Plat of the survey of the said Land, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General:
