To, all to whom these presents shall come greeting:  
Whereas there has been deposited in the General Land Office of the United  
States, a certificate of the Register of the Land Office, at St. Paul, D. S. and Islands  
Nebraska, whereby it appears that pursuant to the Act of Congress approved  
20<sup>th</sup> May 1862 To secure Homesteads to actual settlers on the Public Domain  
and the acts supplemental thereto the claim of Benjamin C. Chapman  
has been established, and duly consummated in conformity to laws  
for the North East quarter of Section eighteen in Township Ten North of  
Range Thirteen West of the Sixth Principal Meridian, in Nebraska  
containing one hundred and sixty acres, according to the  
Official Plat of the survey of the said Land returned to the General  
Land Office by the Surveyor General. Now know ye that there is  
therefor granted by the United States unto the said Benjamin C.  
Chapman the tract of Land, above described to have, and to hold, the  
said tract of Land with the appurtenances thereof unto the said  
Benjamin C. Chapman, and to his heirs, and assigns forever.  
In testimony whereof I Benjamin Harrison President of the United  
States of America have caused these letters to be made Patent  
and the seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed  
Given under my hand at the city of Washington the sixth day of February in the  
year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ninety two and of the Independence  
of the United States the one hundred and sixteenth.
