 To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting:
 Certificate Whereas, William H. Chapman, of Buffalo County,
 No. 1244 Nebraska has deposited in the General Land Office of
 the United States a certificate of the Register of the Land Office at
 Grand Island, Nebraska, whereby it appears that Full Payment
 has been made by the said William H. Chapman according to the
 provisions of the Act of Congress of the 24th of April, 1870, entitled
 "An Act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands" and
 the acts supplementing thereto, for the South East Quarter of Section
 Thirty Three, in Township Nine (9) North, of Range Fourteen West, in
 the District of lands subject to sale at Grand Island Nebraska,
 containing one hundred and fifty-seven acres and one hundred
 and six-tenths of an acre according to the official plat of the Survey of
 the said lands, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor
 General, which said Tract has been purchased by the said William
 H. Chapman, Now, Know ye, That the United States of America,
 in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the
 several Acts of Congress in such case made and provided, have
 given and granted, and by these presents do give and grant, unto
 the said William H. Chapman and to his heirs, the said Tract above
 described; To Have and to Hold the same, together with all the rights,
 privileges, immunities, and appurtenances, of whatsoever nature,
 thereto belonging, unto the said William H. Chapman and to his
 heirs and assigns forever.

In Testimony Whereof, I, Rutherford B. Hayes, President of the United
 States of America, have caused this letter to be made Patent, and the
 Seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto attached.
 Given under my hand, at the City of Washington, the first day of
 October, in the year of our Lord One Thousand Eight Hundred and Eighty
 and of the Independence of the United States the One hundred and fifth.
