Gandy* has been established and duly consummated, in conformity to law, for the *South West Quarter of Section Eight in Township Eight North of Range Sixteen West of the Principal Meridian in Nebraska containing One Hundred and Forty acres*, according to the Official Plat of the survey of the said Land, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General:

Now Know Ye, That there is, therefore, granted by the United States unto the said *John H. Gandy*,
