Whereas, There has been deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Grand Island, Nebraska, whereby it appears that, pursuant to the Act of Congress approved 20th May, 1862, "To Secure Homesteads to Actual Settlers on the Public Domain," and the acts supplemental thereto, the claim of William Dahlke has been established and duly consummated, in conformity to law, for the West half of the North East Quarter, and the West half of the South East Quarter of Section Six in Township Eleven, North of Range Seventeen West of the Sixth Principal Meridian in Nebraska containing one hundred and fifty acres and according to the Official Plat of the survey of the said Land, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General:
