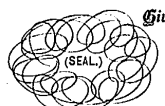

Whereas, there has been deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Grand Island, Nebraska whereby it appears that, pursuant to the act of Congress, approved 20th May, 1862, "To secure homesteads to actual settlers on the public domain," and the acts supplemental thereto, the claim of James D. Murphy has been established and duly consummated in conformity to law, for the South East of the North East quarter, and the lots numbered seven and eight of Section Five in Township Eight, North, of Range fifteen west of the Sixth Principal Meridian in Nebraska, containing one hundred and fifty eight acres and eighty hundredths of an acre
