Greeting:  
Whereas, there has been deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a Certificate of the Registrar of the Land Office at Grand Island Nebraska whereby it appears that pursuant to the Act of Congress approved 20th May 1864 "To secure Homesteads to actual settlers on the Public Domain" and the acts supplemental thereto, the claim of John Doughterty has been established and duly consummated in conformity to law for the North East Quarter of sections twenty two in Township Twelve North of Range eight West of the Sixth Principal Meridian in Nebraska containing one hundred and sixty acres according to the Official Plat of the survey of the said Land, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General: Now Know Ye: that there is therefore granted by the United States unto the said John Doughterty the tract of land above described: To Have and To Hold the said tract of Land with the appurtenances thereto unto the said John Doughterty and to his heirs and assigns forever.

In testimony whereof J. Benjamin Harrison President of the United States of America, have caused these letters to be made Patent and the Seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.
