Whereas John Saul of Buffalo County Nebraska has deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Grand Island whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said John Saul according to the provisions of the Act of Congress of the 24th of April 1820 entitled "An act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands for the Lots numbered five, six, seven and eight of Section four in Township eight North of Range eighteen West in the District of Lands subject to sale at Grand Island Nebraska containing one hundred and twenty seven acres and thirty hundredths of an acre according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said lands returned to the General Land Office by the surveyor General which said tract has been purchased by the said John Saul. Now know ye, That the United States of America, in consideration of the premises and in conformity with the several Act of Congress in such case made and provided have given and granted and by these presents do give and grant unto the said John Saul and to his heirs the said tract above described to have and to hold the same together with all the rights, privileges, immunities and appurtenances of whatsoever nature thereunto belonging unto the said John Saul and to his heirs and assigns forever.

In Testimony whereof I, Ulysses S. Grant, President of the United States of America, have caused these letters to be made Patent, and the Seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed Given under my hand, at the City of Washington, the 21st day of December in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ninety four and of the Independence of the United States the Ninety Ninth
