Whereas, There has been deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Grand Island Nebraska, whereby it appears that, pursuant to the Act of Congress approved 20th May, 1862, "To Secure Homesteads to Actual Settlers on the Public Domain," and the acts supplemental thereto, the claim of Henrich Brinkman has been established and duly consummated, in conformity to law, for the South half of the North East Quarter and the lots numbered one and two of section four in Township eight North of Range fifteen West of the Sixth Principal Meridian in Nebraska containing one hundred and forty four acres and twenty hundredths of an acre according to the Official Plat of the survey of the said Land returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General :

Now Know Ye, That there is, therefore, granted by the United States unto the said Henrich Brinkman the tract of Land above described : TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract of Land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said Henrich Brinkman and to his heirs and assigns forever.

letters to be made Patent, and the Seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.

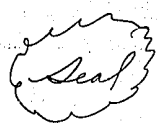

Whereas, There has been deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Lincoln Nebraska, whereby it appears that, pursuant to the Act of Congress March 3rd 1873, March 13, 1874, and June 14, 1878 "To encourage the growth of timber on the western approved 20th May, 1862, "To Secure Homesteads to Actual Settlers on the Public Domain," and the acts supplemental thereto, the claim of Usher A. Day has been established and duly consummated, in conformity to law, for the West half of the North West Quarter of Section thirty four in Township four North of Range fourteen West of the Sixth Principal Meridian in Nebraska containing eighty acres according to the Official Plat of the survey of the said Land, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General :

Now Know Ye, That there is, therefore, granted by the United States unto the said Usher A. Day the tract of Land above described : TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract of Land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said Usher A. Day and to his heirs and assigns forever.
