Decker Now Know Ye, That there is therefore granted by the United States unto the said John W. Decker the tract of land above described, to have and to hold the said tract of land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said John W. Decker and to his heirs and assigns forever.

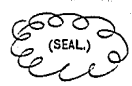
