Certificate No. 4293. - To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting: Whereas George L. Schum of Buffalo County Nebraska has deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Grand Island Nebraska whereby it appears that full Payment has been made by the said George L. Schum according to the provisions of the Act of Congress of the 24<sup>th</sup> of April 1820 entitled "An act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands" and the acts supplemental thereto for the East half of the South East Quarter of section seven<sup>and</sup> the East half of the North East Quarter of section Eighteen in Township twelve North of Range seventeen West of the Sixth Principal Meridian in Nebraska containing one hundred and sixty acres according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said lands returned to the General Land Office by the surveyor general which said tract has been purchased by the said George L. Schum. Now know ye that the United States of America in consideration of the premises<sup>and</sup> in conformity with the several Acts of Congress in such case made<sup>and</sup> provided here given<sup>and</sup> granted<sup>and</sup> by these presents do give and grant unto the said George L. Schum<sup>and</sup> to his heirs the said Tract above described. To have<sup>and</sup> to hold the same together with all the rights privileges, immunities<sup>and</sup> appurtenances of whatsoever nature thereunto belonging unto the said George L. Schum<sup>and</sup> to his heirs<sup>and</sup> assigns forever. In testimony whereof Benjamin Harrison President of the United States of America has caused these letters to be made patent<sup>and</sup> the seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed. Given under my hand at the City of Washington the thirteenth day of July in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ninety<sup>and</sup> of the Independence of the United States the one hundred<sup>and</sup> fifth.
