The United States of America To all to whom these presents shall come Greeting: Whereas there has been deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Grand Island Nebraska whereby it appears that pursuant to the Acts of Congress approved March 31 1873, March 13, 1874 and June 14, 1878 "To encourage the Growth of Timber on the Western Prairie" the Claim of John Demuth has been established and duly consummated in conformity to Law for the North West Quarter of Section two in Township nine North of Range eighteen West of the Sixth Principal Meridian in Nebraska containing one hundred and sixty acres according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said Land returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General. Now Know Ye that there is therefore granted by the United States unto the said John Demuth the tract of Land above described To have and to hold the said tract of Land with the appurtenances thereof unto the said John Demuth and to his heirs and assigns forever.

In Testimony Whereof I Benjamin Harrison President of the United States of America have caused these letters to be made Patent and the seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.

Given under my hand at the City of Washington the sixth day of June in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ninety and of the independence of the United States the one hundred and fourteenth.
