Homestead Certificate No. 8369... Application 17770...

Whereas, There has been deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Grand Island, Nebraska, whereby it appears that, pursuant to the Act of Congress approved 20th May, 1862, "To Secure Homesteads to Actual Settlers on the Public Domain," and the acts supplemental thereto, the claim of John H. Derryberry North East quarter of section six in Township ten north of Range eighteen west of the sixth principal Meridian in Nebraska, east one hundred and fifty acres and twenty four hundredths of an acre according to the Official Plat of the survey of the said Land, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General:

Now Know Ye, That there is, therefore, granted by the United States unto the said John H. Derryberry the tract of Land above described: TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract of Land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said John H. Derryberry and to his heirs and assigns forever.

In Testimony Whereof, I Benjamin Harrison, President of the United States of America, have caused these letters to be made Patent, and the Seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.

Given under my hand, at the City of Washington, the Fifth day of June in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ninety, and of the Independence of the United States the one hundred and fourteenth.

Whereas, There has been deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Lincoln, Nebraska, whereby it appears that, pursuant to the Act of Congress approved 20th May, 1862, "To Secure Homesteads to Actual Settlers on the Public Domain," and the acts supplemental thereto, the claim of Amanda Diebke formerly Amanda Schuchas been established and duly consummated, in conformity to law, for the South East quarter of Section twenty in Township eleven North of Range seventeen West of the sixth Principal Meridian in Nebraska containing one hundred and sixty acres according to the Official Plat of the survey of the said Land, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General:

Now Know Ye, That there is, therefore, granted by the United States unto the said Amanda Diebke the tract of Land above described: TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract of Land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said Amanda Diebke and to her heirs and assigns forever.
