No. The United States of America, To all whom
these present shall come greeting: Whereas, by virtue of
the 3rd section of the act of Congress approved January
28th, 1879, supplemental to the acts approved June 22d, 1860
March 2d 1867, and June 10th 1872, there has been deposited
in the General Land Office of the United States a certi-
ficate of the register of the Land office at Grand Island
Nebraska whereby it appears that Supreme Court
Scrip No R. 8.94 Subdivision No. — for 160 acres, has
been located by Rico H. Eaton and his claim
thereby established and duly consummated in conform-
ity to law for the South West quarter of section thirty
five, in township nine North, of range 15 West of
the Sixth Principal meridian in Nebraska, containing
one hundred and sixty one acres and seventy-three hun-
dredths of an acre, (Excess Paid) according to the official
plat of the survey of the said land, returned to the
general Land office by the surveyor general:

Now know ye, that there is, therefore granted
by the United States unto the said Rico H. Eaton
the tract of land above described: to have and
to hold the said tract of land, with the appurtenances
thereof unto the said Rico H. Eaton and to his heirs
and assigns forever.

In testimony whereof I, Chester A. Arthur President of
the United States of America, have caused these letters to
be made Patent, and the seal of the general Land Office
to be hereunto affixed. Given under my hand, at the City
of Washington, the first day of June in the year of our Lord
one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two and of
the Independence of the United States the one hundred
and sixth.
