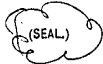

Whereas, there has been deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Grand Island Nebraska whereby it appears that, pursuant to the act of Congress, approved 20th May, 1862, "To secure homesteads to actual settlers on the public domain," and the acts supplemental thereto, the claim of John Wesley Keel of Buffalo County Nebraska is established and duly consummated in conformity to law, for the purchase of Public Land and the acts supplemental thereto for the lot-number seven (7) of section ten, and the lots numbered four (4) and five (5) of section eleven (11) in Township Eight north of Range fourteen west of the sixth Principal meridian in Nebraska containing one hundred and twelve acres and ninety hundredths of an acre now known to the United States of America in consideration of the purchase and in conformity with the several acts of Congress in such case made and provided to be given and granted and by these presents do give and grant unto the said John Wesley Keel and his heirs the said tract upon the described to have and to hold the said tract of land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said John Wesley Keel and his heirs and assigns forever.
