Griffin has been established and duly consummated, in conformity to law, for the North West quarter of Section four in Township ten North of Range eighteen East of the sixth Principal Meridian in Nebraska containing one hundred and fifty nine acres and seventy five hundredths of an acre according to the Official Plat of the survey of the said Land, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General:

Now Know Ye, That there is, therefore, granted by the United States unto the said Terence C. Griffin the tract of Land above described: TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract of Land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said Terence C. Griffin and to his heirs and assigns forever.
