according to the Official Plat of the survey of the said land, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General:

Now Know Ye, That there is therefore granted by the United States unto the said Lewis A Colburn the tract of land above described, to have and to hold the said tract of land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said Lewis A Colburn and to his heirs and assigns forever.
