Whereas there has been deposited in the General Land Land Office of the United States a certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Grand Island Nebraska, whereby it appears that pursuant to the acts of Congress approved March 3-1873, March 13, 1874 and June 14-1878 "To encourage the Growth of Timber on the western Prairies" the claim of George August Kemp, has been established and duly consummated in conformity to law, for the South half of the South West quarter and the South half of the South East quarter of section ten, in Township eleven North of Range seven West of the sixth Principal Meridian in Nebraska containing one hundred and sixty acres according to the Official Plot of the survey of the said land, returned to the General Land Office by the survey General; Now know Ye that there is therefore granted by the United States unto the said George August Kemp the tract of land above described to have and to hold the said tract of land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said George August Kemp

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and to his heirs and assigns forever.
