Homestead Certificate No. 5308. The United States of America,

Application 8652 To all to whom these presents shall come greeting:

Whereas, there has been deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Grand Island, Nebraska whereby it appears that, pursuant to the act of Congress approved 2d. May, 1862 "To secure homesteads to actual settlers on the public domain," and the acts supplemental thereto, the claim of Bernhard Koeppe has been established and duly confirmed in conformity to law, for the lots numbered thirteen, fourteen, twenty-three and twenty-four of Section eighteen in Township ten North of Range sixteen West of the Sixth Principal Meridian in Nebraska containing one hundred and sixty acres, according to the official plat of the survey of the said land returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General: Now know ye, that there is therefore granted by the United States unto the said Bernhard Koeppe the tract of land above described: To have and to hold the said tract of land with the appurtenances thereto unto the said Bernhard Koeppe and to his heirs and assigns forever.

In testimony whereof, I, Grover Cleveland, President of the United States of America have caused these letters to be made Patent and the Seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto applied.

Given under my hand at the city of Washington the Thirtieth day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty five, and of the Independence of the United States the one hundred and ninth.
