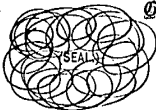

Whereas, there has been deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Grand Island, Nebraska whereby it appears that, pursuant to the act of Congress, approved 20th May, 1862, "To secure homesteads to actual settlers on the public domain," and the acts supplemental thereto, the claim of Anthony Wayne has been established and duly consummated in conformity to law, for the South half of the North West quarter and the North half of the North West quarter of Section Twelve in Township Twelve North, of Range Thirteen West of the Sixth Principal Meridian, in Nebraska, containing one hundred and sixty acres

according to the Official Plat of the survey of the said land, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General:

Now Know Ye, That there is therefore granted by the United States unto the said Anthony Wayne the tract of land above described, to have and to hold the said tract of land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said Anthony Wayne and to his heirs and assigns forever.

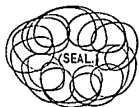
