To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting,

Whereas there has been deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Grand Island, Nebraska, whereby it appears that pursuant to the Act of Congress approved 20th May, 1862 "To secure Homesteads to actual Settlers on the Public Domain" and the acts supplemental thereto, the claim of Mary E.A.C. Nave, John Nave and Delia I Nave, minor orphan children of John E. Nave deceased has been established and duly consummated in conformity to law for the South East Quarter of Section two in Township twelve North of Range Fifteen West of the Sixth Principal Meridian in Nebraska containing one hundred and sixty acres according to the Official Plat of the survey of the said land returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General.

Now know ye that there is therefore granted by the United States unto the said Mary E.A.C. Nave, John Nave and Delia I Nave, the tract of land above described to have and to hold the said tract of land with the appurtenances thereto unto the said Mary E.A.C. Nave, John Nave and Delia I Nave and to their heirs and assigns forever.

In Testimony whereof I Chester A. Arthur President of the United States of America have caused these letters to be made Patent and the seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.

hundred and eighty three and of the Independence of the United States the one hundred and eighteenth.
