To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting.
Whereas there has been deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a Certificate of the Registrar of the Land Office at Grand Island Nebraska whereby it appears that pursuant to the Act of Congress approved 20th May 1862 "To secure Homesteads to actual settlers on the Public Domain" and the acts supplemental thereto the claim of Mary E. A. C. Nave John Nave and Delia I Nave minor orphans of John E. Nave deceased has been established and duly consummated in conformity to law for the South East Quarter of Section two in Township twelve North of Range Fifteen West of the Sixth Principal Meridian in Nebraska containing one hundred and sixty acres according to the Official Plat of the survey of the said land returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General.

Now know ye that there is therefore granted by the United States unto the said Mary E. A. C. Nave John Nave and Delia I Nave the tract of land above described to have and to hold the said tract of land with the appurtenances thereof unto the said Mary E. A. C. Nave, John Nave and Delia I Nave and to their heirs and assigns forever.

In Testimony Whereof I Chester A. Arthur President of the United States of America have caused these letters to be made Patent and the Seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.
