To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting: Whereas John Neal of Buffalo County, Nebraska has deposited in the general land office of the United States a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Grand Island Nebraska where by it appears that full Payment has been made by the said John Neal according to the provisions of the Act of Congress of the 24th of April, 1820, entitled "An Act making further provision for the sale of Public Lands" and the acts supplemental thereto, for the south half of the south east quarter of section five and the north half of the north east quarter of section eight in Township twelve north of range sixteen west of the Sixth Principal Meridian in Nebraska containing one hundred and sixty acres according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said lands, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said Tract has been purchased by the said John Neal.
