The United States of America. To all whom these
presents may come. Greeting.
Certificate No. 1400. Whereas Martin Kevin of
Buffalo County, Nebraska has deposited in the general
Land office of the United States a certificate of the
register of the Land Office at Grand Island, Nebraska
whereby it appears that full payment has been made
by the said Martin Kevin according to the provisions
of the Act of Congress of the 24th of April, 1820, entitled an
act making further provisions for the sale of the Public
Lands, and the acts supplemental thereto, for the North
East quarter of the South West quarter and the lots
numbered seven eight and nine of section seven in
Township eight North of range sixteen West of the Sixth
Principal Meridian in Nebraska containing one
hundred and twenty two acres and ten hundredths
of an acre. according to the official plan of the survey
of the said lands, returned to the General Land
Office by the Surveyor General, which said Tract has
been purchased by the said Martin Kevin.

Now know ye. That the United States of America,
in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with
the several Acts of Congress in such case made and
provided, have given and granted, and by these presents
do give and grant, unto the said Martin Kevin and
to his heirs, the said Tract above described; to have
and to hold the same, together with all the rights,
privileges, immunities and appurtenances, of whatsoever
nature, therunto belonging, unto the said Martin
Kevin and to his heirs and assigns forever.

In testimony whereof, I, Chester A. Arthur, President of
the United States of America, have caused these letters to
be made Patent, and the seal of the General Land Office to be
hereunto affixed. Given under my hand at the City of
Washington, the twentieth day of October, in the year of our Lord
one thousand eight hundred and eighty two, and of the
Independence of the United States the one hundred and seventh
by the President Chester A. Arthur
