To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting:
Certificate Whereas, William Muttter of Buffalo County, Nebraska,
No. 1790 has deposited in the General Land Office of the
United States a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at
Grand Island, Nebraska, whereby it appears that full payment
has been made by the said William Muttter according to the provisions
of the Act of Congress of the 24th of April, 1820, entitled "An Act
making further provisions for the sale of the Public lands," and
the acts supplemental thereto, for the lots numbered two, three and
four of section seven in Township Eight north of Range fourteen
West and the lot numbered five of section twelve in Township
eight North of Range fifteen West of the Sixth Principal Meridian in
Nebraska, containing one hundred and sixty three acres and sixty
four hundredths of an acre, according to the official plat of the sur-
vey of the said lands, returned to the General Land Office by the Sur-
veyor General, which said tract has been purchased by the said Wil-
liam Muttter. Now know ye, that the United States of America, in
consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the several Acts
of Congress in such case made and provided, have given and granted,
and by these presents do give and grant, unto the said William Muttter
and to his heirs, the said tract above described; To Have and to Hold the
same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurten-
ances, of whatever nature, thereunto belonging, unto the said William
Muttter and to his heirs and assigns forever.

In Testimony Whereof, I, Chester A. Arthur, President of the United
States of America, have caused these letters to be made patent, and the
seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.
Given under my hands, at the City of Washington, the Twenty sixth
day of October, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and
eighty three, and of the Independence of the United States the One hundred
and Eighth.
