Whereas, there has been deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Grand Island Nebraska whereby it appears that, pursuant to the act of Congress, approved 20th May, 1862, "To secure homesteads to actual settlers on the public domain," and the acts supplemental thereto, the claim of Samuel Van Dyke has been established and duly consummated in conformity to law, for the west half of the south east quarter of Section twelve in Township Nine, of Range fifteen west in the district of lands subject to sale at Grand Island Nebraska containing eighty acres

according to the Official Plat of the survey of the said land, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General:
