Whereas, There has been deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Grand Island Nebraska, whereby it appears that, pursuant to the Act of Congress approved 20th May, 1862, "To Secure Homesteads to Actual Settlers on the Public Domain," and the acts supplemental thereto, the claim of Monroe Jenkins has been established and duly consummated, in conformity to law, for the Lot No. Hundred fifteen Twenty-one and Twenty-two of Section Eighteen in Township eleven North of Range sixteen West of the Sixth Principal Meridian in Nebraska containing one hundred and sixty Acres according to the Official Plat of the survey of the said Land, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General:
