 Greeting: Homestead Certificate No. 452 }  
 Application 4242. } Whereas There has been  
 deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a certificate  
 of the Register of the Land Office at Grand Island, Nebraska,  
 whereby it appears that, pursuant to the Act of Congress approved  
 20<sup>th</sup> May, 1862, "To secure Homesteads to actual Settlers on the  
 Public Domain," and the acts supplemental thereto, the claim of  
 Adam Ream has been established and duly consummated, in  
 conformity to law, for the Lots numbered, One, Two, Three, and  
 Four of section twelve, in Township Eight North, of Range Sev-  
 enteen West, in the District of Lands subject to sale at Grand  
 Island, Nebraska, containing one hundred and twenty eight acres  
 and fifty hundredths of an acre, according to the Official Plat  
 of the survey of the said land, returned to the General Land  
 Office by the Surveyor General: Now know ye, That there is,  
 therefore, granted by the United States unto the said Adam Ream  
 the tract of Land above described: To have and to hold the said  
 tract of Land, with the appurtenances thereof unto the said  
 Adam Ream and to his heirs and assigns forever. In testi-  
 mony whereof, I, Ulysses S. Grant, President of the United States of  
 America, have caused these letters to be made Patent, and the  
 seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.
