Richardson has been established and duly consummated in conformity to law, for the

South half of the South East quarter and the east half of the south west quarter of section thirty two, in Township Eleven north of Range fourteen west of the Sixth Principal Meridian in Nebraska containing one hundred and sixty acres

according to the Official Plat of the survey of the said land, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General:

Now Know Ye, That there is therefore granted by the United States unto the said George D. Richardson the tract of land above described, to have and to hold the said tract of land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said George D. Richardson and to his heirs and assigns forever.
