Certificate. } The United States of America,
No. 1109. } Do all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting:
Whereas Charles Reilly of Buffalo County, Nebraska, has
deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a
Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Grand Island,
Nebraska, whereby it appears that full payment has been made
by the said Charles Reilly according to the provisions of the Act of
Congress of the 24th of April, 1820, entitled, "the Act making further
provision for the sale of the Public Lands" and the acts supplemental
thereto, for the Northeast Quarter of Section thirty-one in Township nine
North of Range Fourteen West in the district of lands subject to
sale at Grand Island, Nebraska, containing one hundred and
sixty acres according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said
lands, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General,
which said tract has been purchased by said Charles Reilly;
Now Know Ye - That the United States of America, in consideration
of the premises, and in conformity with the several Acts of Congress
in such case made and provided have given and granted, and
by these presents do give and grant, unto the said Charles Reilly,
and to his heirs, the said Tract above described: Do have ^{us} to hold
the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities and
appurtenances, of whatsoever nature, therunto belonging, unto the
said Charles Reilly and to his heirs and assigns forever.
In Testimony Whereof, I, Rutherford B. Hayes, President of the
United States of America have caused these letters to be made Patent,
and the Seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.
Given under my hand, at the City of Washington, the twenty first-
day of July, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and
eighty nine, and of the Independence of the United States the one
hundred and fourth.
