come - Greeting:

Whereas, There has been deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Grand Island, Nebraska, where by it appears that, pursuant to the Act of Congress approved March 3-1873, March 13-1874 & June 14-1878, "to encourage the growth of timber on the Western Prairies, the claim of the heirs of Alongs Rines, deceased has been established and duly consummated, in conformity to law, for the North-west Quarter of Section 110, in Township ten, North of Range thirteen west of the Sixth Principal Meridian in Nebraska, containing one hundred and sixty two acres and forty hundredths of an acre; according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said Land, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General: Now know ye, That there is, therefore, granted by the United States unto the said Heirs of Alongs Rines, deceased, the tract of Land above described: To have and to hold the said tract of Land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said Heirs of Alongs Rines, deceased, and to their heirs and assigns forever. In Testimony Whereof, I, Benjamin Harrison, President of the United States of America have caused these letters to be made Patent, and the seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed. Given under my hand at the City of Washington, the eighth day of November in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty nine, and of the Independence of the United States the one hundred and fourteenth.
