To all to whom these presents shall come, greeting:  
Whereas there has been deposited in the General Land Office  
of the United States a certificate of the register of the Land  
Office at Grand Island Nebraska where by it appears that  
pursuant to the acts of Congress approved March 3, 1873  
March 13, 1874 and June 14, 1878 "To encourage the growth  
of timber of the western prairies" the claim of Buraine  
F. Rogers has been established and duly consummated in  
comformity to law for the lot numbered three-four-nine  
and ten of Section seven in Township twelve, North of  
range sixteen, west of the Sixth Principal Meridian in  
Nebraska containing one hundred and sixty acres according  
to the Official Plat of the survey of the said land, returned  
to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General:

Now know ye that there is therefor granted by the United  
States unto the said Buraine F. Rogers the tract of land  
above described: To have and to hold the said tract of land  
with the appurtenances thereto, unto the said Buraine F. Rogers  
and to his heirs and assigns forever. In testimony whereof  
I. Benjamin Garrison, President of the United States of America,  
have caused these letters to be made Patent and the seal of  
the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed. Given under my  
hand at the City of Washington the Twenty seventh day  
of May in the year of our Lord one thousand eight  
hundred and ninety, and of the Independence of the United  
States the one hundred and fourteenth.
