McKey, has been established and duly consummated, in conformity to law, for the South West quarter of Section Twenty-Eight in Township Ten North of Range Fourteen West of the First Principal Meridian in Nebraska, containing One Hundred and Sixty Acres, according to the Official Plat of the survey of the said Land, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General:

Now Know Ye, That there is, therefore, granted by the United States unto the said George W. McKey, the tract of Land above described: TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract of Land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said George W. McKey, and to his heirs and assigns forever.
