To all to whom these presents shall come greeting:

Whereas, John W. Rose of Buffalo County, Nebraska has deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Grand Island, Nebraska, whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said John W. Rose according to the provisions of the act of Congress of the 24th of April, 1820, entitled "An act making further provision for the sale of the public lands," and the acts supplemental thereto for the lots numbered five and six of Section nine in Township eight North of Range thirteen West of the Sixth Principal Meridian in Nebraska, containing ninety five acres, according to the official plat of the survey of the said lands, returned to the General Land Office by the Survey General, which said tract has been purchased by the said John W. Rose. Now know ye, that the United States of America, in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the several acts of Congress in such case made and provided, have given and granted, and by these presents do give and grant unto the said John W. Rose and to his heirs, the said tract above described To have and to hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities and appurtenances of whatsoever nature thereunto belonging, unto the said John W. Rose and to his heirs and assigns forever.

In testimony whereof I, Benjamin Harrison, President of the United States of America, have caused these letters to be made Patent and the Seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.

Given under my hand at the city of Washington the Third day of November in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ninety one, and of the Independence of the United States the one hundred and sixteenth.
