The United States of America, I call to whom these presents shall come, Greeting; Whereas John W. Boyle of Buffalo County, Nebraska, has deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Grand Island, Nebraska, whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said John W. Boyle according to the provisions of the Act of Congress of the 24th of April 1820 entitled "An act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands" and the acts supplemental thereto, for the southwest quarter of the southeast quarter of Section twelve, and the west half of the northeast quarter and the southeast quarter of the northeast quarter of Section thirteen in Township twelve north of Range seventeen west of the sixth Principal Meridian in Nebraska containing one hundred and sixty acres, according to the official ^{part of the} Survey of the said lands, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said tract has been purchased by the said John W. Boyle now known ye, that the United States of America in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the several Acts of Congress in such case made and provided, have given and granted, and by these presents do give and grant; unto the said John W. Boyle and to his heirs, the said tract above described; to have and to hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities and appurtenances of whatsoever nature, thereto belonging, unto the said John W. Boyle and to his heirs and assigns forever. In Testimony whereof, I Benjamin Harrison, President of the United States of America, have caused these letters to be made Patent, and the seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed. Given under my hand, at the City of Washington the twentieth day of July in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eightynine, and of the Independence of the United States, the one hundred and fourth.
