Salisbury has been established and duly consummated, in conformity to law, for the North West quarter of Section thirty four in Township twelve North of Range fourteen West of the Sixth Principal Meridian in Nebraska, containing one hundred and sixty acres according to the Official Plat of the survey of the said Land, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General:

Now Know Ye, That there is, therefore, granted by the United States unto the said John S. Salisbury the tract of Land above described: TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract of Land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said John S. Salisbury and to his heirs and assigns forever.
