The United States of America,

To all to whom these presents shall come greeting:

Whereas, Emelia K. Schaub, of Buffalo County, Nebraska, has deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Grand Island, Nebraska, whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said Emelia K. Schaub according to the provisions of the act of Congress of the 24th of April 1820, entitled 'An act making further provision for the sale of the public lands,' and the acts supplemental thereto, for the East half of the South East quarter of Section one, in Township twelve, North, of Range seventeen West, of the Sixth Principal Meridian, in Nebraska, containing eighty acres according to the official plat of the survey of the said lands, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said tract has been purchased by the said Emelia K. Schaub. Now know ye, that the United States of America, in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the several acts of Congress in such case made and provided, have given and granted, and by these presents do give and grant, unto the said Emelia K. Schaub and to her heirs, the said tract above described, to have and to hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities and appurtenances, of whatsoever nature, thereto belonging, unto the said Emelia K. Schaub and to her heirs and assigns forever.

In testimony whereof, I Benjamin Harrison, President of the United States of America, have caused these letters to be made Patent and the Seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed. Given under my hand, at the city of Washington, the twenty-third day of December, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, and of the Independence of the United States the one hundred and fourteenth.
