Whereas, there has been deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Grand Island Nebraska whereby it appears that, pursuant to the act of Congress, approved March 3, 1873, March 13, 1874 and June 14, 1875, "To secure of the growth of timber with Prunus the claim of Charles Schrick has been established and duly consummated in conformity to law, for the North West quarter of Section eighteen in township eleven north of range fourteen west of the Sixth Principal Meridian in Nebraska containing one hundred and fifty five acres and twenty eight hundredths of an acre,

according to the Official Plat of the survey of the said land, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General:

Now Know Ye, That there is therefore granted by the United States unto the said Charles Schrick the tract of land above described, to have and to hold the said tract of land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said Charles Schrick and to his heirs and assigns forever.
