

South half of the North East quarter, and the North half of the South East quarter of section thirty-four in Township twelve, North of Range thirteen west of the Sixth Principal Meridian in Nebraska, containing one hundred and sixty acres.

according to the Official Plat of the survey of the said land, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General:

Now Know Ye, That there is therefore granted by the United States unto the said May Schluend the tract of land above described, to have and to hold the said tract of land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said May Schluend and to his heirs and assigns forever.


