Whereas There has been deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Grand Island Nebraska, whereby it appears that: Pursuant to the act of Congress, approved 20th May 1862 "To secure Homesteads to actual Settlers on the Public Domain" and the acts supplemental thereto, the Claim of Jacob Schutrum has been established and duly consummated, in conformity to law, for the west half of the north west quarter of section thirty, in Township ten of Range fifteen west in the district of lands subject to Sale at Grand Island Nebraska containing Seventy seven acres and eighty four hundredths of an Acre according to the official Plat of the Survey of the said Land, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General.

Now Know ye, That there is, therefore, granted by the United States unto the said Jacob Schutrum, the tract of land above described. To have and to hold, the said Tract of Land with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said Jacob Schutrum and to his heirs and assigns forever.

In Testimony Whereof, J. Myer S. Grant, President of the United States of America, have caused these letters to be made Patent, and the Seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed
