No. 5387 } To all to whom these presents shall come greeting:  
Whence Ella Slotte, of Buffalo County, Nebraska has deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Grand Island, Nebraska whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said Ella Slotte according to the provisions of the act of Congress of the 24th of April, 1820, entitled "An Act making further provision for the sale of the public lands; and the acts supplemental thereto, for the lots numbered ten of Section fourteen and the lots numbered six and seven of Section fifteen in Township eight North of Range fifteen West of the Sixth Principal Meridian in Nebraska containing ninety two and twenty four acres of land according to the official plat of the survey of the said lands returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said tract has been purchased by the said Ella Slotte.

Now know ye that, that the United States of America, in consideration of the premises and in conformity with the several Acts of Congress in such case made and provided, have given and granted, and by these presents do give and grant unto the said Ella Slotte and her heirs, the said tract above described, to have and to hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities and appurtenances, whatsoever nature, therunto belonging unto the said Ella Slotte and to her heirs and assigns forever.

In testimony whereof, I, Benjamin Harrison, President of the United States of America, have caused these letters to be made Patent, and the seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto annexed.

Given under my hand at the city of Washington the Twelfth day of December in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ninety, and of the Independence of the United States one hundred and fifteenth.
