To all to whom these presents shall come greeting:
Whereas, there has been deposited in the General Land Office of the United States, a certificate of the register of the Land Office at Grand Island, Nebraska, whereby it appears that, pursuant to the act of Congress approved 20th May, 1862, "To secure Homesteads to actual settlers on the public domain," and acts supplemental thereto, the claim of Louisa Smith, widow of Sardinus Smith, deceased, has been established and duly consummated, in conformity to law, for the North East quarter of Section four in Township twelve, North of Range fourteen West of the Sixth Principal Meridian in Nebraska, containing one hundred and fifty-nine acres and eighty-three hundredths of an acre, according to the official plat of the survey of the said land returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General: Now know ye, that there is, therefore granted by the United States unto the said Louisa Smith the tract of land above described: To have and to hold the said tract of land, with the appurtenances thereof unto the said Louisa Smith and to her heirs and assigns forever.

In testimony whereof, I, Benjamin Harrison, President of the United States of America have caused these letters to be made patent, and the seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.
