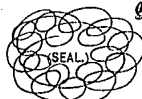

Whereas there has been deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Grand Island, Nebraska, whereby it appears that, pursuant to the act of Congress, approved 20th May, 1862, "To secure homesteads to actual settlers on the public domain," and the acts supplemental thereto, the claim of Gary A. Borders has been established and duly consummated in conformity to law, for the North half of the North West quarter of Section eighteen in township ten, North, of Range fifteen west of the Sixth Principal Meridian in Nebraska, containing eighty two acres and three hundredths of an acre.

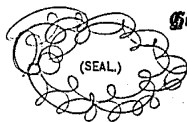
