Herrick has been established and duly consummated in conformity to law, for the

lots numbered five six seven and eight of section one and the lot numbered seven of section two in township eight north of range thirteen West of the Sixth Principal Meridian in Nebraska containing One hundred and five acres

according to the Official Plat of the survey of the said land, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General:

Now Know Ye, That there is therefore granted by the United States unto the said Andrew J. Herrick the tract of land above described, to have and to hold the said tract of land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said Andrew J. Herrick and to his heirs and assigns forever.
