Steele has been established and duly consummated in conformity to law, for the North East quarter of Section and in Township eight - Eight - north of Range sixteen west in the district of lands subject to sale at Grand Island Nebraska containing one hundred and fifty eight - acres and sixteen hundredths of an acre

according to the Official Plat of the survey of the said land, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General:
