

Certificate No. 1303. The United States of America, to all to whom these presents shall come, greeting. Thomas Abner Stimpson of Buffalo County, Nebraska, has deposited in the General Land Office of the United States, a certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Grand Island Nebraska, whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said Abner Stimpson to the provisions of the Act of Congress of the 2d of April 1880 entitled "An Act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands and the acts supplemental thereto for the North East Quarter of Section Thiry Two in Township Nine, North of Range Fifteen west of the 6<sup>th</sup> Principal Meridian in Nebraska, containing One Thousand and Sixty Acres, according to the official plan of the survey of the said lands returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General which said Tract has been purchased by the said Abner Stimpson. Now, know ye, That the United States of America, in consideration of the premises and in conformity with the several acts of Congress, in such case made and provided have given and granted, and by these presents do give and grant unto the said Abner Stimpson and to his heirs, the said Tract above described, to have and to hold the same together with all the rights, privileges, immunities and appurtenances of whatso ever nature thereunto belonging unto the said Abner Stimpson and to his heirs and assigns forever. In testimony whereof, I Chester A. Arthur, President of the United States of America have caused these letters to be made Patent and the seal of the General Land Office to be affixed thereto under my hand at the City of Washington, the first day of June in the year of our Lord One Thousand Eight Hundred and Eighty Two and of the Independence of the United States the One Thousand and Sixth
